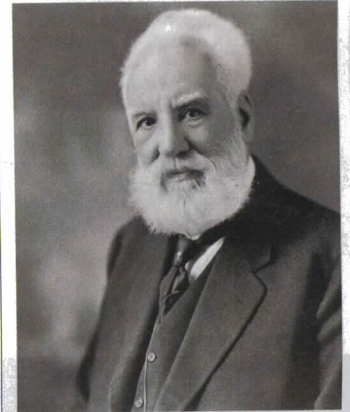

CONCRETE PROGRESS

To mark the significant progress on phase one of the £1 billion Barnsley Building Schools for the Future programme, students from Barnsley joined the project teams for a series of traditional topping-out celebrations.

Two projects in Carlton and Darton invited students, teachers and councillors to complete the final concrete pour. The projects started on site in July 2009 and range in value from £27m to £34m. All 13 of Barnsley's secondary schools will be replaced with advanced learning centres as part of a three-phase programme to transform education in the area.
